What is SIC's Open Track Day (Car)?

An Open Track Day is an event where you get to bring and drive your own car on Sepang International Circuit (SIC) race track. Your guests may also drive on the track. No racing experience is required but participants need to have a full valid driving license or a race license. The Open Track Day experience offers a thrilling track-side experiences for all drivers.

How to Secure Your Slot?

You may register online at www.sepangcircuit.com/tickets/opentrackday. To register, you will need to complete all the details online. To secure your slot, you will need to pay the applicable charges. Online registration will cease 3 days prior to the event day after which registration can only be done at the SIC Track Office complete with payment, subject to availability.

Completing your registration and payment online will reduce your queue time and reduce administrative time spent at the Track Counter on the event day. Please be present at the Track Office on the event day 1 hour before the start time of your session. Please also remember to download the online indemnity form during your registration process. Fill up this form and submit it at the track office on event day.

Charges & Payment

Each car may be brought onto the race track at only MYR 300 per car per hour. You may pay online at the end of the registration process via Visa or Master through our Paypal gateway. Alternatively we also accept direct bank transfer into our account through M2U, CIMB clicks etc. Once you have made your payment, do send your proof of payment to our Track Office.

Registration will be held as 'pending' status until payment is received by SIC. A registration with 'pending' status is not a confirmed booking and SIC can delete or replace such a registration at its own discretion without prior notice.

Safety & Track Day Gear

No one plans to crash their car but the worst can happen. Luckily, there are ways to protect yourself if it does happen.

Helmet

The most common safety item is a helmet. All track days will require one. If you don't have one you can hire from SIC, but based on availability as helmets are very limited.

Clothing

Most beginners will go to the track in street clothes and this is fine if you wear the right fabrics. Avoid synthetic materials like polyester as they melt when exposed to fire. Cotton and wool are better choices as they burn slower and will offer some protection. Long pants, long sleeves and long socks are highly recommended but not a requirement. Singlets and shorts are not allowed.

Shoes

Most drivers have their own preferred shoes for driving. A pair of actual driving shoes not only help you feel the pedals better but they will also protect you from fire. Closed toe shoes and sandals are not allowed. Only FULLY covered shoes are allowed.

Track Day Preparation

Let's assume you have secured your slot with plenty of time to spare. You're going to need a little bit of preparation, both for yourself and your car in order to make the most of the day. Give your car a thorough inspection a week before the track day. If you find anything wrong you'll have plenty of time to put it right! An oil leaking car is not allowed onto the track.

On Event Day

Before Arrival

Make sure your car is not leaking oil. Ensure it is filled with enough fuel / has a full tank before entering the circuit. It's also a good idea to buy bottles of water or some snacks or sandwiches.

Upon Arrival

Make your way to the Track Office, arriving nice and early, time has a habit of moving quickly once you're there. The administration process at the track office will include:

1. Queue (if you have a confirmed booking slot, please proceed to the Express lane)
2. Complete registration (not needed if you are at the Express lane)
3. Complete the indemnity form
4. Sign and submit the indemnity form in the presence of the Track Office personnel.
5. Pay the applicable charges (not needed if you are at the Express lane).
6. Receive your car wrist-band and assigned pit number, depending on your car category.
7. Basic briefing (for newbies or for refresher purposes)



Getting Ready

You will then proceed with your car(s) to the assigned pit where you will perform last minute check on your car and get suited up. You will then wait at your pit.

At the appointed time, you will hear the signal from the Pit Exit marshal (usually a horn being sounded) upon which you shall then bring your car to queue at the Pit Exit lane. The said marshal shall then inspect each car to ensure compliance to SIC's Rules & Regulations, especially safety matters (e.g. not wearing safety helmet). Cars and/or participants that do not comply will be sent back to their pits for rectification.

Do not leave your personal belongings unattended. SIC would not be accountable for the loss of items.

Please ensure that you follow SIC's Rules & Regulations. Any person displaying drunken, dangerous or unruly behaviour will be asked to leave the circuit premises and any payment made for their bookings will be forfeited.

Track Damage Charges

Tyre Barriers, Guard Rails Etc.

These are safety equipment that have prevented some serious crashes from becoming life threatening but are very costly to repair and replace. If you do crash on the track and damage these equipment, you will have to pay for damage charges.

Oil Spill

Drivers who cause oil spill will be charged based on the damage done.

What happens if I Get into an Accident on the Track?

SIC is one of the safest circuits in the world, equipped with standard safety measures and run off areas if your car goes off the track.

SIC's officials will monitor every inch of the track during a track day and will be able to see any incidents happening on the track. They will take immediate and procedural actions based on the incident, such as stopping the session (Red Flag) and sending in medical and recovery teams to the scene. Whenever you are involve in an incident, don't panic. Please wait for the medical and recovery team to arrive and assist you.

If an accident involves other drivers, do not stop to assist the driver involved. Leave the accident to the experienced marshals.

Be safe, be smart on the track and enjoy the experience of driving safely on one of the best F1 & MotoGP Circuits in the world!
